In Year 7 we have launched the Hunsley Award, an award to celebrate contribution and excellence beyond the classroom. Our Year 7 students are proudly wearing honours badges for participation in key enrichment opportunities.

Instrumental Ensembles and Choir

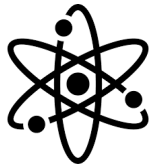
