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Dear Parent/Carer

Following our earlier communication on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> June, I am now writing to give further detail about how we are looking to evolve our model of “on demand” resources to continue to support your child’s learning, based on the feedback we have received and the best educational evidence available.

‘On demand’ learning ensures that students can access lessons with a higher level of student and staff interaction, at a time that is most convenient for them and your family. We know this is essential, especially where students have limited access to technology, or where they are sharing a device between a number of siblings or family members. These lessons will increasingly use methods such as narrated Power Points or video. Students will be set a task and at certain points on that task there will be recorded video explanation and teaching from their teacher. We will also be making increased use of Microsoft Teams as the platform on which staff share work with students.

There are several advantages for students using Microsoft Teams compared to the current online platform:

- Each class that a student is a member of can be set up as a ‘Team’. This means all the assignments and resources for that subject and that class are in one place.
- Students can clearly see the tasks they have been set and the dates these are due, in the assignments section of their Team.
- Students can easily submit work in a variety of formats including Word documents and Power Point files. Photographs can be used if they prefer to complete work in hand written format. These are uploaded and submitted through the assignments section of each Team.
- Students can receive feedback from staff through the assignments section of each Team.

To enable further training for students and staff, the timeline we are working towards is as follows:

- Starting on Monday 22 June Year 10 and Year 12 learning will be issued through the Microsoft Teams platform. An increasing number of departments will be making use of more interactive teaching methods, including PowerPoint narration and video content. We are also exploring the live chat function on Microsoft Teams as a way to interact.
- From Monday 6 July learning for all year groups will be set using the Microsoft Teams platform.

*As we have said previously, with so much continuing uncertainty about how schools will look in September, this approach gives the flexibility that students will need. Should the government’s guidelines in September mean that not all students are on site at one time, they will have access to a high quality hybrid curriculum of on demand online and face to face learning. And once all students are back in school together, we will have a permanent library of recordings which will form a crucial part of our catch up and revision programmes for students.*
